ABOUT THE IMPACT

SARCOMA FOUNDATION OF AMERICA

SVF is excited to partner with the Sarcoma Foundation of America (SFA) and is providing \$55,000 to fund a grant for soft tissue sarcoma research. A panel of experts will review applications for this grant and will determine the recipient based on potential to discover new information about soft tissue sarcoma that will lead to improved patient outcomes. Since 2000, SFA has provided over \$20,000,000 in research grants, and SVF looks forward to seeing the impact this grant will make.

NORTON HEALTHCARE

SVF continues its collaborative efforts with Norton Cancer Institute (NCI). In 2022, SVF allocated \$100,000 to enhance the cancer genomics laboratory. Throughout the current year, these funds have facilitated increased accessibility to laboratory services, addressing the financial challenges associated with these expensive tests that may not be covered by insurance. SVF's financial support has played a pivotal role in eliminating barriers to services, ensuring that patients receive timely information to make informed decisions about their treatment. Furthermore, the foundation has recently committed an additional \$40,000 to NCI, reinforcing our dedication to funding healthcare initiatives and addressing the diverse needs of patients. This ongoing partnership reflects SVF's steadfast commitment to advancing healthcare accessibility and patient support.

MEMORIAL SLOAN KETTERING CANCER CENTER

The foundation remains committed to its ongoing support for Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK) and has recently contributed an additional \$45,000 towards the crucial research undertaken by the MSK team. This brings SVF's total contributions to MSK to over \$650,000 since the foundation's establishment. The extra funding will be directed towards sustaining a clinical trial aimed at discovering improved treatment options for desmoplastic small round cell tumor (DSRCT), a rare and aggressive form of sarcoma that impacted Steven. Dr. Slotkin, the leading expert on DSCRT overseeing the trial, expresses optimism about completing the study in 2024 and anticipates positive outcomes. SVF proudly holds the position of the primary financial supporter for this study, which revolves around the exploration of a promising novel drug, omburtamab.

CAMP QUALITY

SVF was thrilled to partner with Camp Quality this year. Camp Quality is a week-long camp for pediatric cancer patients whose motto is "letting kids with cancer be kids again." SVF board members were given the opportunity to visit camp and check out all the fun. The foundation gave \$3,000 to sponsor a professionally planned and executed fireworks show for the campers.

FUNDRAISING EVENTS

SPIKE OUT SARCOMA

The sixth annual Spike Out Sarcoma, presented by Shady Rays, raised over \$35,000! The sand volleyball tournament was held on August 5 at King Louie's Sports Complex. Twenty-four teams braved the heat to compete for the title of champion and to bump, set, and spike for a cure.

SPIN FOR STEVEN

The gentlemen of the Pi Kappa Alpha (PIKE) fraternity hosted Spin for Steven on April 16 at the Muhammad Ali Center. With campus and community support and participation, over \$46,000 was raised for SVF! The young men of PIKE work hard all year long to raise awareness of sarcoma and tell Steven's story.

CHARLIE GEORGE INVITATIONAL

Steven Vanover Foundation was honored to be one of the beneficiaries of the Charlie George Invitational. Over 200 golfers participated in the scramble at Nevel Meade Golf Club on Saturday, August 12, and \$7,067 was donated to SVF.

The St. Albert the Great Golf Scramble was on Friday, September 15, at Eagle Creek Golf Course. SVF deeply appreciates the 21 teams that participated and the St. Albert GAP Club for raising over \$7,500.
